4-H is a community of young people across America who are learning leadership, citizenship, and life skills.

From the National 4-H Blog, Jennifer Sirangelo, President and CEO of National 4-H Council:

America is facing a leadership crisis. Many young people today aren't being given the opportunity to learn the tenacity, strategic-thinking and people skills that they'll need to lead – now and in the future.

For me, leadership started at home as a big sister. As the oldest of four kids, I took on a lot of responsibility early on in my life. My dad worked two jobs and my mom was my first mentor, and she saw the unique potential in me and each of my siblings and helped us cultivate it. Caring adults like my mom and others stepped up and gave me the opportunities I needed to grow essential life skills.

But recent research conducted by 4-H suggests that today's youth aren't getting the leadership opportunities they want and need. In the 2016 4-H National Youth Survey on Leadership, two-thirds of respondents said they don't have the tangible skills they needed to lead. Half of high school students said they don't feel prepared to lead in college or a future career.

That's a discouraging statistic. When our survey asked youth why they hadn't taken opportunities to learn leadership skills, the number one reason they gave was that no one had asked them.

4-H wants to change that. We've launched our Grow True Leaders Campaign to highlight the experiences offered to young people that grow leadership skills. Through self-chosen projects, kids will be paired with mentors and given opportunities to lead. These projects will bring out their potential, their passions and their drive to help others, as we empower them to become true leaders.

In 4-H, we believe that every child has the potential to be a leader, and in order to fulfill that potential they need caring adult mentors, chances to develop practical skills, and opportunities to take on leadership roles. As America's largest youth development organization, we know this approach works and our results are second to none.

If we're going to fill the coming leadership void, adults must play a larger role in encouraging kids and offering them the hands-on experiences that will help them build confidence and grow skills.

We're supporting our youth, and we're asking adults across the country to do the same. Let's rally the nation to grow a generation of true leaders.

For our youth who will be 9th grade and above this summer, consider applying to be a 2017 Summer 4-H Camp Counselor and expand your leadership skills! (see pp. 8-9)



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<u>Meat Animal Quality Assurance has been made a mandatory requirement for all exhibitors showing any livestock</u> Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goats, Dairy, Poultry and Rabbits that are housed at the Eau Claire County Fair for 2017.

This email states the plan for Quality Assurance education for 2016-2017. Please read thoroughly!

The Eau Claire County Fair Committee has chosen to <u>make MAQA a mandatory requirement for 2017.</u>

Because our exhibitors and animal exhibits are on public display, and because the treatment and care is a reflection on our fair, it is critical that exhibitors have a good understanding of the expectations of the public's view of how animals are cared for and these expectations should be implemented not only during the fair, but practiced at home and on our farms as well.

This year's MAQA topic will be: Animal Health Products, coupled with VFD & Veterinary Feed Directive.

- The MAQA meetings for Eau Claire County have been scheduled.
 Monday, January 30, 2017 7PM at the Eau Claire County Extension Office, Altoona.
 Saturday, February 18, 2017 9:30AM at the Eau Claire County Extension Office, Altoona.
 Monday, April 10, 2017 6:30PM at Osseo-Fairchild High School. LOCATION CHANGE!
 - 2. There will be an option to test out by taking an exam; however this year the exam will have a <u>1</u> <u>year certification ONLY</u>. It will NOT serve for more than one year as in previous years. Youth already in the system that have certifications that are current because they took the exam will be grandfathered in. PLEASE NOTE: you will need to contact the Extension Office to set up a time to take the exam. To pass, you must score at least 75%. Exhibitors who do not pass the test may opt to take the test again, but must schedule a different time and day to retest.
 - Meat Animal Quality Assurance (MAQA) meetings in other counties.
 If you are not able to attend one of the meetings offered in Eau Claire County, families may visit the link below to find a meeting that is relatively close and can work in their schedule Weblink: http://fyi.uwex.edu/maqa/maqa-meetings/
 - 4. PLEASE NOTE that this requirement <u>MUST</u> be completed by <u>JULY 1, 2017</u> to show at the 2017 fair. Please plan ahead and attend a meeting or test out before July 1! NO exceptions will be made!

<u>For 2017-2018 and beyond:</u> MAQA will be known as YQCA (youth for the quality care of animals) and will continue to be implemented in Eau Claire County. Beef, Sheep, Swine, Goats, Dairy, Poultry and Rabbits will all be included in presentation information regarding the importance of animal care.

In 2018 Wisconsin State Fair will require YQCA for all junior show exhibitors in Beef, Sheep, Swine, Dairy, Goats, Poultry and Rabbits. The National Western stock show will start requiring YQCA from all youth exhibitors starting in 2018.

We know that this is a transition year with many exhibitors involved in livestock projects with different youth memberships and leaders. To ensure that nobody is missed or not made aware of the new requirements, we are asking leaders, advisors and other exhibitors to pass along the information.

2017 4-H Summer Camp Changes

Changes for 2017 Dunn/Eau Claire 4-H Summer Camp!

It's already time to be thinking about 2017 Summer 4-H Camp, held this year June 12-15, 2017. Cloverbud Camp will be June 13-14, 2017. In order to best meet the needs of all of our campers and offer a camping opportunity to the most campers possible, we are offering a short outpost camping experience for 7th and 8th grade campers at the 2017 Summer 4-H Camp. **ALL YOUTH who are in grades 7 and 8** will be required to participate in camp in this experience. It will offer an opportunity for youth to learn basic camping tasks while freeing up space for our Cloverbud campers. Because we will be utilizing beds in Cedar Lodge for part of this experience, we will be able to accommodate additional campers for the entire week, hopefully eliminating any wait list. Below are some details you need to know about 2017 Summer 4-H Camp!

-All youth in grades 3-6 will participate in cabin camp as per usual and be housed in one of the five cabins at Beaver Creek.

-All youth in grades 7-8 will participate in camp as per usual through Tuesday afternoon when color group rotations are done. They will be housed in the dorms of Cedar Lodge at Beaver Creek. After color groups and water games are done, they will move their belongings out of Cedar and pitch tents at the tenting area of Beaver Creek. They will then stay in tents and have an outpost experience (cooking own dinner and breakfast, own campfire, etc) until the following morning. Their items can be moved into the main lodge in the morning when they take down their tents and clear their area before boarding busses at 9:15am to head to Lake Wissota State Park with the rest of the campers. This outpost experience is not optional to 7th and 8th graders-if you attend camp, you will be tent camping for one night.

-Cloverbud Campers will arrive the afternoon of Tuesday, June 13 and stay through the early afternoon of Wednesday, June 14. They will be housed in Cedar Lodge while the 7th and 8th graders are tent camping.



ALL plays must be registered at the Chippewa County Extension Office by Monday, February 27. Telephone registrations will NOT be accepted.

A set of rules for our festival follow.

- Entry Division and Length of Performances: The difference between the two drama categories is as follows:
 - a. On-Stage Drama is a traditional one-act play using full costumes, props and sets. This may be performed on a stage with or without curtains.
 - One play, any length up to 30 minutes, including set-up and take-down time. It is suggested that performances be about 20 minutes in length.
 - Performances must include two or more actors.
 - 3. Any props that touch the floor must have felt on them to protect the floor.
 - b. Mini-Dramas and Skits can be performed at or in any place (setting) and might include puppetry, creative dramatics, etc. No stage or lighting will be provided. Performances must include two or more actors.
 - 1. *Mini-dramas* may use costumes and props similar to on-stage drama performances
 - 2. Skits use minimal props and costumes (less is better)
 - 3. Mini drama and skit performances can be any length up to 15 minutes, including setup and take-down time. Plays need to be within guideline.
 - c. Puppetry can be up to 15 minutes and provide own puppet stage.
- All actors must be 4-H members. The director(s) may be any 4-H member(s) and/or adult(s).
- 3. Stage lighting may be available, depending on facilities (mini-drama and skits no stage or lighting provided).
- On-Stage Drama Props: Drama groups should plan for special props and sound effects equipment as needed. Any props need to have felt on the bottom to avoid scratching the stage.

- 5. No hay or straw bales, animals, candles, real fire or real weapons are allowed.
- 6. If a club uses fake weaponry or strobe lights, it must be noted on the registration form.
- 7. Clubs may have more than one entry, but a 4-H member can be involved in only one play.
- The Drama Festival staff will have a Stage Manager/Emcee who will introduce the Club and the Club's Emcee. The Club's Emcee will be expected to introduce the play and set the scene for their play. Introduction of cast used at club's discretion. This will not be timed.
- 9. Your presentation must not be the same one your club presented last year.
- 10. Music plays (NOT reviews), where music is used as part of the play, are acceptable.
- 11. Each group will receive a critique from the evaluators. Each drama participant will receive a participation ribbon and certificate. Ratings will be gold or silver.
- 12. Each entry will be given an "Award of Merit" for their area of outstanding achievement. The awards will be given from the following categories:
 - Total Voice Projection
 - Cooperation, Enthusiasm and Spirit
 - Characterization
 - Creative Costuming
 - Audience Appeal
 - Creative Theme Development
 - Set
 - Humor
- Individual awards for outstanding youth performers will be presented, not to exceed two youth per play.
- 14. Best Actor and Best Actress will be selected from each county.

Other helpful information

Evaluation Form: Upon your request, the committee will send an evaluation form that will be used at the festival. It notes the essential parts for viewing and critiquing a dramatic performance, and will be your copy for study prior to the play.
