

Berliner Kranser Cookies

3 hard-boiled egg yolks, mashed 1 cup sugar

4 raw egg yolks 6 cups cake flour

2 cups butter 1 tsp vanilla

Mix hard-boiled egg yolks, raw egg yolks, butter and sugar. Blend in flour and vanilla. Press into wreath shapes or balls. Bake at 350 degrees until light golden brown, about 8-10 minutes.

What is a lip sync battle?

Groups involved will put together a performance lip-syncing to one song or a compilation of songs to perform in front of the fair audience. Lip syncs should be humorous for the audience, a group effort, and inclusive to all age ranges. The winner will be chosen by selected judges and will receive a prize.

Guidelines:

- Music should be no longer than 2 minutes; music can be one song or a compilation of songs.
- Music must be available on device that can play its own music (ex. cell phone, tablet, computer, stereo, etc.)
- 3. Performances should be appropriate in song and in actions for all ages.
- 4. It is recommended that performances be planned ahead of time with optional choreography and props.
- 5. One performance per club/chapter; all county organizations are encouraged to participate! (4-H, FFA, Boy Scouts, etc.)

Can our club still perform our drama/music performance at the Fair Entertainment?

We are still welcoming drama or music performances as part of the Fair Entertainment this year, but will not be offering this for next year. This year will serve as a bridge year between the past set up of the Fair Entertainment and the new set up. We hope to make the Lip Sync Battle a continuing event if it is well received at the fair.

Why should my group perform in the County Fair Lip Sync Battle?

- 1. Give members ability to perform in front of large audience
- 2. Opportunity for team building and group bonding
- 3. Creativity skills can be used and/or grown
- 4. Fun for all ages

This new event is intended to give a fun, modern twist on our Fair Entertainment. We hope that this new idea will be more fitting to our venue and hopefully create an improved experience for our fair goers.
