Purpose of the 4-H Recordbook

One of the requirements to achieve in 4-H is to create and submit a recordbook each year. The actual due date varies from club to club, so please check with your club's general leader.

Besides achieving, doing a record book has many benefits.

- # It is necessary to be nominated for leadership awards.
- # It is necessary when applying for 4-H trips.
- # It is a great reference to look back at when completing college applications.
- **#** It is a fun way to document your adolescent life.

Your record book needs the following pages:

- 1. <u>Title Page</u> (Please include a-e on your title page, be creative)
 - a. Your Name
 - b. Picture of yourself
 - c. Your age
 - d. Your club name
 - e. Number of years in 4-H
- 2. <u>4-H Year in Review Goals</u> (goals set at beginning of year, and results at end of year)
- 3. <u>4-H Year in Review Activities</u> (document what you did this 4-H year month by month at the club, county, district and state/national level)
- 4. <u>None 4-H Year in Review</u> (document this year's achievements, activities and community service outside of 4-H)
- 5. 4-H Year by Year Records Projects (document the project codes you enrolled in each year)
- 6. <u>4-H Year by Year Records Service</u> (document the offices you held and committees you were on each year)
- 7. <u>4-H Year by Year Records Activities</u> (a summary of highlights for each year at the club, count and district/state/national level)
- 8. <u>Tell Us Your Story</u> (see instruction page included, be creative)
- 9. **Projects** (see instruction page included, be creative)
- 10. My 4-H Achievement Records (check list of items you need to do to achieve in 4-H)
- 11. <u>Public Exhibits</u> (document your Public Exhibits for this 4-H year) (if using the word version, you may delete the lines not needed)
- 12. **Voice of the Parent** (comments about you from your parent(s).
