Dear 4-H Families,

"Bring a Friend to 4-H..."

With October 7-13 being National 4-H Week and all of our clubs beginning their new 4-H year, this is a great time to think about promoting our program and recruiting new members. If you have good ideas for recruitment, please consider sending them to the Extension Office, so that they can be shared with others.

One great suggestion for promoting our program is the idea of encouraging 4-H members to bring a non-4-H friend with them to spend a day at the county fair or other 4-H events, like Discovery Day, STEM Day Camp, Cloverbud Day Camp. Why not get started promoting in October...during national 4-H week there is a daily sponsored County wide challenge that promotes 4-H, all 4-H youth are encouraged to participate. Challenge **EVERY** member to bring a non-4-H friend to the next 4-H meeting.

While none of these may be new ideas, we sometimes need a reminder that we can all be involved in promoting the 4-H program. And it is important to remember that while fall, with the 4-H year just beginning, is a wonderful time to promote 4-H, that promotional efforts should not be limited to a single event or just one time of year. Promotional efforts should be considered for the entire 4-H year, with our full calendar of awesome opportunities. We would like you to think about ways to involve your non-4-H friends in lots of the fun, educational activities that you do in 4-H.

Another great aspect of this way of looking at promotion is that it also lends itself to community service. In addition to the goal of recruitment, "Bring a friend to 4-H" could also mean sharing time and friendship with someone who would really appreciate the experience. In the 4-H sense of "adopt a friend" this could mean helping someone who is elderly, lonely, doesn't get out a lot, or who may not have as many opportunities as you enjoy, to experience some of the fun that you and your family have in 4-H.

You can begin right now! Start thinking about all of the 4-H events to which you can *bring a friend* - club meetings and outings, countywide events, your project activities, summer camp, the fair, and more.


