Agriculture



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I have accepted an offer to be the new and first ever Dairy Outreach and Program Manager for Extension. The proposed start date will be effective August 1. 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In June, I continued to relationship build with the Eau Claire County Master Gardeners. I attended their June board meeting and am currently working with them on describing and uploading their volunteer projects to our new online reporting system. This has been a good opportunity for me to better understand the wonderful work being done by the Master Gardeners.

Jeffers Community Garden is in full swing. We have 41 plots currently rented. A thank you to the City of Eau Claire Utilities for their quick response in fixing a few malfunctioning water spigots out at the gardens. I will be working with them to make sure the water pipes are winterized when our gardening season comes to a close.

Horticulture inquiries continue to come in from Eau Claire County. With the help of Andy, we are fielding questions across the board on trees, lawns, insects, flowers, vegetables and sapsucker damage. Some are disease related but we get a fair share of id requests together with questions on invasive species.

Concerning the horticulture program area needs assessment and relationship building in the county, I continue to reach out to people to learn more about county resources and potential partners as I prepare my plan of work.

Community Development

During the month, I have enjoyed working with dedicated and passionate people in Eau Claire County to organize sustainable community food systems that support local farmers, increase access to fresh healthy food for all residents, and address environmental challenges. As indicated in previous monthly highlights, this is a part of Clear Vision larger community development effort that resonates with many people and organizations during the community needs assessment. With expertise in Sustainable Agriculture and Community-based Food systems, as well as strategic planning, my major role is to assist with organizing, resource access, and planning, including setting realistic measurable goals and evaluation mechanism to track progress. Related to agriculture, I have a great time presenting and talking with youth at the Wisconsin Farmer Union Camp about food systems and agriculture.

I took two weeks vacation after six months of intense needs assessment and relationship building in Dunn and Eau Claire Counties. I am back to work this week and will be preparing my plan of work for the three counties.

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Joy and Pamela are starting Week 3 in the Kids' Garden at North River Fronts Park partnering with the Boys & Girls Club. This week there are 26 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders working in the garden with Judy Mitchell, an Extension Master Gardener Volunteer. They are focusing on weeding along with harvesting strawberries, sugar snap peas, and lots of greens.

During small group rotations to the garden, the kids also participate in a fun nutrition activities, focusing on healthy habits. We always end the garden session with a tasting event. This week they will be exploring lots of different salad greens, pea pods, bok choy, green onions, and blueberry compote with greek yogurt!

Next week Joy and Pamela will be teaching at the Boys & Girls Club with the teens using lessons from Teen Cuisine.

Joy is finishing up a Teen Cuisine four week series at Western Dairyland Fresh Start, with young adults. She will be starting another Teen Cuisine four week series at the Extension Office with teens from Juvenile Detention 180 Program. This program focuses on healthy eating, kitchen skills and food safety along with preparing healthy snacks, applying what they are learning during the four week program.

Pamela is wrapping up a six week series this week at Affinity House, teaching 15 women about choosing healthy foods, focusing on fruits and vegetables, limiting added sugars, food safety and smart meal planning.
