Educational opportunities in the Dog Project

The **dog training skills** youth learn are:

- Agility the handler directs their dog through a course of obstacles
- Rally a sport for dogs based on obedience that uses signs put into a pattern that creates a course
- Showmanship handling abilities, breed characteristics, dog care, and presenting different breeds in competition
- Obedience heel, sit, sit-andstay, stand-and-stay, and come when called. Obedience training teaches your dog how to behave in and away from home, as well as how to behave around other people and dogs.

Participation Rules & Regulations

Dog Handlers:

- Handlers will need to bring treats, a six-foot leather or nylon leash, training collar, water bowl and water, bags for cleanup
- Handlers need to wear rubber soled shoes and clothes that can get dirty

Canine Participants:

- Up-to-date distemper and rabies vaccinations (it is recommended that the dog be vaccinated for kennel cough and that they receive a parasite check)
- Female dogs who are inseason should not be brought to class
- Dogs that show aggression will be excused from class
