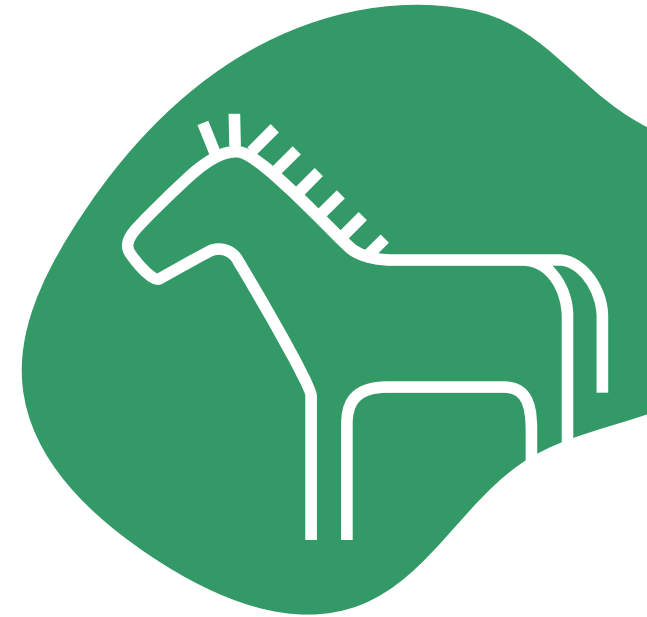

General Information

- The Eau Claire County Horse Project makes an effort to educate both riders and horses. Riders develop skills such as how to safely handle and care for a horse, as well as a wide variety of horsemanship skills.
- This project is open to all youth grades 3rd and up.
- Horses are not provided. Youth must have a horse of their own, or access to one which they can practice on, but they do not need experience riding a horse to join.
- Youth who do not have access to a horse can participate in horse photography, model horse, horse hippology, and animal science.

Schedule

- November: The Eau Claire County Horse Project has their first meeting, this introductory meeting is important for all, especially families new to the Horse Project
- November-May on the 1st Thursday of every month: educational meetings
- May-July on Tuesdays: skill clinics
- May-July on Thursdays: open arena, where riders can independently practice their skills
