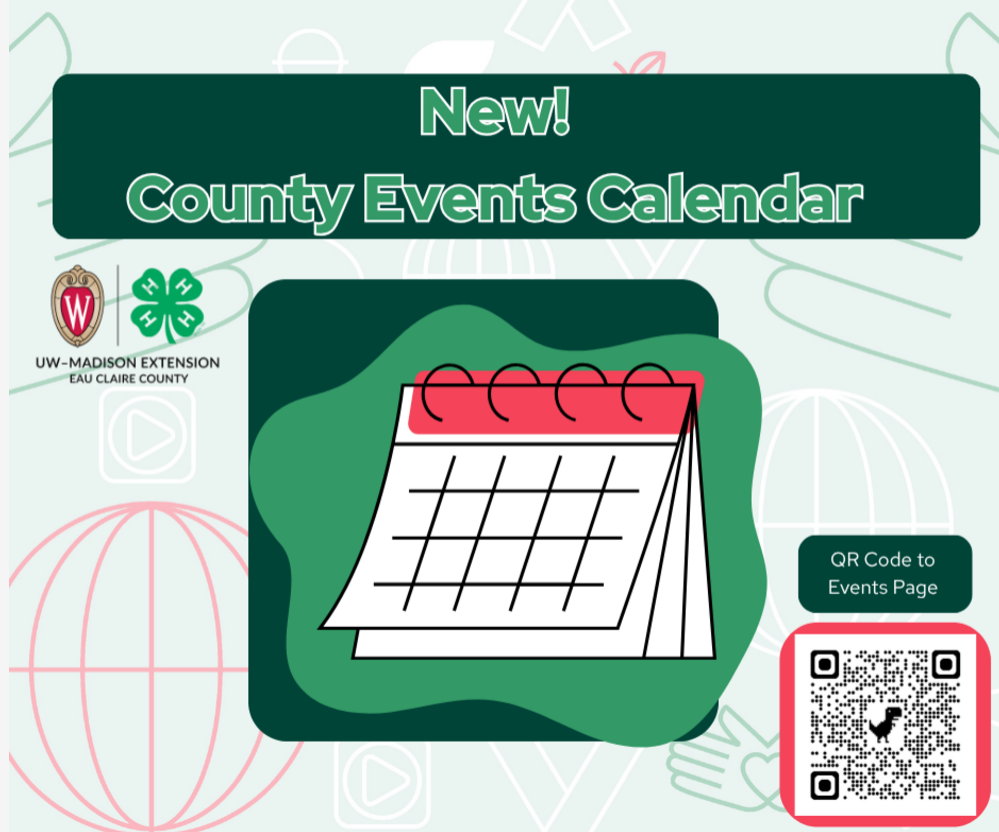

We will be making: Swedish Crackers, Cornmeal cranberry cookies and Hilbeh (Middle Eastern Fenugreek Cake)

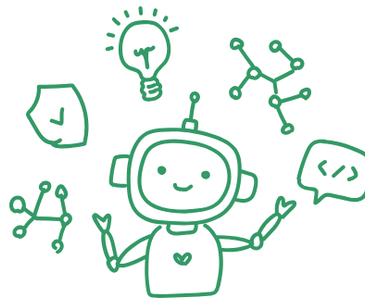

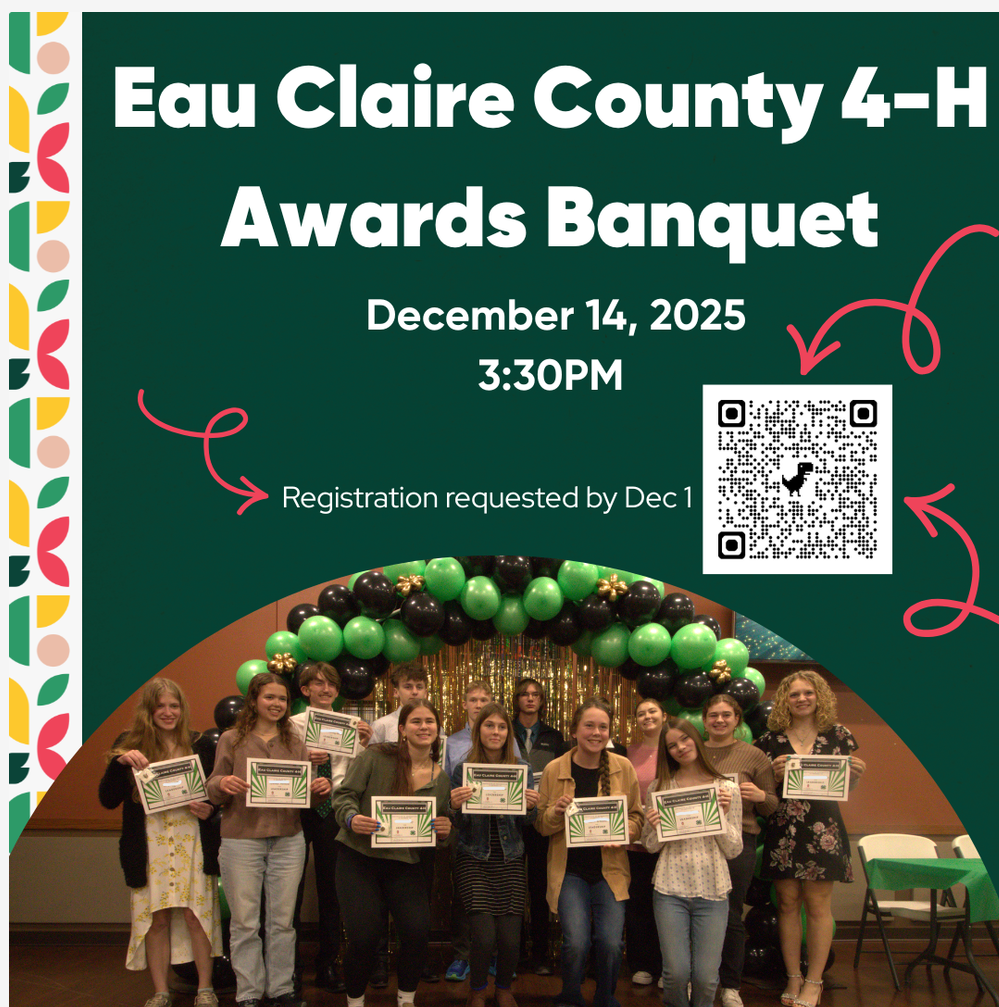

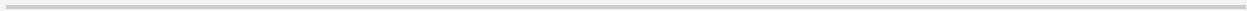
